Most of these animals are reared inside huge, crowded, stinking factory farms, where they are bred to grow as big as possible in the shortest possible time. They are unable to take proper exercise or do many of the things they would naturally do. At only a few weeks or months old, they die a terrifying death at the slaughterhouse.

The male chicks of egg-laying hens are treated as trash. They are killed at a day old and their dead bodies sold as fertilizer.

Millions of 'exotic' animals, such as parrots, snakes, tropical fish and monkeys, are caught in the wild and imported for people to keep as pets. Large numbers die during

capture and transport, and many suffer short, unhappy lives because their owners don't know how to look after them properly.

It doesn't matter if your companion animal is a large horse or a tiny goldfish - all have individual needs. All require a proper home, space, the correct diet, a constant water supply, exercise, companionship and opportunities for play and privacy.
